TYPES OF HEPATITIS

Hepatitis can be types A, B, C, D, E, F and G.

The most dangerous are B and C.

TRANSMISSION - HEPATITIS B AND C

From blood transfusions carried out before 1993, tattoos, drug use, piercing, manicure, sexual relations without protection (in the case of hepatitis b).

SYMPTOMS - HEPATITIS B AND C

Often they don't show up, but when they do the most common are yellowish skin and eyes, nausea and vomiting, feeling ill, dark urine and pale faeces. If it is not treated hepatitis can progress to cirrhosis and liver cancer.

PREVENTION - HEPATITIS B AND C

Do not share toothbrushes, nail clippers, shaving razors, syringes and do use condoms for sexual relations. In the case of hepatitis b there is a vaccine. Get information from your local health center.

CURE

Hep B: There is no cure, but it is possible to diminish the virus with treatment.

Hep C: There is a cure, but you need to be diagnosed in time.
